

BOROUGH OF QUARRYVILLE – COUNCIL MINUTES

REGULAR MEETING – SEPTEMBER 4, 2018

Borough Council held its Regular Meeting on the above date at 7:00 PM at the Municipal Building. Council President Joy Kemper called the meeting to order with the following persons present: Council Members Joy Kemper, Mike Sullenberger, Robert Kauffman, Jim Kreider, and Diane Hastings. Mayor Joseph Bledsoe, Borough Manager/Secretary Ken Work, Maintenance Superintendent Bill Lamparter, Police Chief Clark Bearinger and Administrative Assistant Judy Aspril were also present at the meeting.

PUBLIC COMMENT: President Kemper asked for public comments and the following comments were made:

Quarryville Library: Andy Wagner, Quarryville Library Board Secretary, presented a brief review of library programs and events for 2018.

Quarryville Fire Company: Representatives from the Quarryville Fire Company advised they have planned a Halloween Parade to be held October 20, 2018, beginning at 6:00 PM. The route will again be from the Quarryville Elementary School to the Fire Station and treats and games will be available at the fire station after the parade.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES – REGULAR MEETING – AUGUST 6, 2018: It was moved by Councilwoman Hastings and seconded by Councilman Sullenberger that the minutes of the August 6, 2018 Regular Meeting be approved and the motion was unanimously approved.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES – WORK SESSION – AUGUST 27, 2018: It was moved by Councilman Sullenberger and seconded by Councilman Kauffman that the minutes of the August 27, 2018 Work Session be approved and the motion was unanimously approved.

BOROUGH MANAGER'S REPORT:

2019 Minimum Municipal Obligation - Police Pension Plan & Non-Uniform Pension Plan: Council received the 2019 MMO information for the Quarryville Borough Police Pension Plan and the Quarryville Borough Non-Uniform Pension Plan. The total cost of both plans for 2019 is \$147,628 and will be included in the 2019 Borough Budget. Copies of the 2019 MMO worksheets will be distributed to all required parties.

Fire Police Assistance Requests: A request for fire police and police assistance was received from East Drumore Township for Lapp's Restaurant Cruisin Event to be held on September 9, 2018 and also from Colerain Township for fire police assistance for the Black Rock Retreat Bike-A-Thon to be held on September 14 & 15, 2018. It was moved by Councilman Sullenberger and seconded by Councilwoman Hastings to approve the request for fire police and police assistance at Lapp's Restaurant Cruisin event on September 9, 2018 and for fire

police assistance at Black Rock Retreat's Bike-A-Thon on September 14 and 15, 2018. The motion was unanimously approved.

Ordinance Codification: As directed by Council at the August 6, 2018, the Borough Manager contacted General Code, the company previously contracted for Ordinance Codification. General Code will review the information they originally received and advise what will be needed to proceed with the codification.

FINANCIAL REPORT AND MONTHLY BILLS – AUGUST 31, 2018: Council received the financial report and bills for August 2018. It was moved by Councilman Kauffman and seconded by Councilman Lawson that the financial report be received and the monthly bills for August in the amount of \$113,486.78 be ratified and the motion was unanimously approved.

POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT: Chief Bearinger briefly reviewed the Police Report for August 2018 noting the arrests and calls for service. Officer Thompson participated in the National Night Event at the Providence Township Building on August 7, 2018. PSP CLEAN audit was completed and passed.

The School Resource Officer agreement with Solanco School District has been revised to include Officer Wolfe on an 8 hour per week basis. After discussion, it was moved by Councilman Lawson and seconded by Councilman Sullenberger to approve the revised SRO agreement and the motion was unanimously approved. The agreement will be presented to the School Board at the September 10, 2018 meeting for approval.

Officer Robert Burns has accepted a fulltime position with the Strasburg Borough Police Department and is requesting to return to part time status with the Quarryville Borough Police Department. After discussion, it was moved by Councilwoman Hastings and seconded by Councilman Sullenberger to accept the resignation of Officer Robert Burns from his fulltime position and return to a part time position with the Quarryville Borough Police Department. The motion was unanimously approved.

After discussion, it was moved by Councilman Sullenberger and seconded by Councilman Kauffman to approve the relocation of Police Officer firearm training from the Southern Lancaster County Farmer Sportsmen Association to the Strasburg Borough Police Department range. The motion was unanimously approved.

ZONING OFFICER REPORT: Council received the Zoning Officer report for August 2018 as submitted by Mark Deimler.

QUARRYVILLE BOROUGH AUTHORITY: Maintenance Superintendent Bill Lamparter reviewed the minutes of the August 21, 2018 Authority meeting.

OLD BUSINESS: After discussion, Council was in agreement to increasing the donation to the Quarryville Fire Department by \$3,000 in the proposed 2019 Borough Budget.

EXECUTIVE SESSION: It was moved by Councilman Lawson and seconded by Councilwoman Hastings to enter into executive session to discuss a personnel issue. The

motion was unanimously approved and Council entered into the Executive Session at 7:35 PM.

Following the Executive Session, the Regular Meeting was reconvened.

It was moved by Councilman Lawson and seconded by Councilman Sullenberger to terminate the employment of Officer Donald Matthew Creighton effective immediately on this date, September 4, 2018. The motion was unanimously approved.

ADJOURNMENT: It was moved by Councilman Kreider and seconded by Councilwoman Hastings that the meeting be adjourned. The motion was unanimously approved and the meeting was adjourned at 7:45 PM.
