

**BOROUGH OF QUARRYVILLE**  
**STREETS/INFRASTRUCTURE/PARKS COMMITTEE MEETING**  
**APRIL 3, 2023**

The Streets/Infrastructure/Parks Committee held its meeting on the above date at 5:00 PM at the Municipal Building with the following persons present: Councilwoman Bowman, Councilman Braightmeyer, Councilman Kreider, Mayor Cavallaro and Borough Manager Scott Peiffer.

**PUBLIC COMMENT:** None

**OLD BUSINESS:**

**LIME/STATE STREETS SIGNAL UPDATE:** The traffic signal warrant study is nearing completion. The Manager will get updated engineering cost opinions for the signal for the committee to make a recommendation to Borough Council in May. There was discussion on some changes that can be made in the intersection until a signal can be installed. Scott will look into road markings and signage with LTAP assistance.

**HUFFNAGLE PARK SECURITY CAMERAS:** The internet connection has been installed by Frontier and Malstrom Alarm is planning on installation of the cameras as soon as all the materials for the job are in place.

**SPEED HUMP SURVEY UPDATE:** After discussion, the committee instructed the Manager to get cost opinions on engineering as well as installation of speed humps for Stanton Rd. and Fifth St. Scott will contact ELA and LTAP for more information. The Committee also felt that we should get the results out to the public. Results will be posted on the Borough website.

**TRAFFIC CIRCULATION STUDY UPDATE:** The Manager reported that he will be scheduling another meeting with PennDOT Connects to see where we are with the possibility of funding for the Traffic Circulation Study.

**SECOND STREET BRIDGE UPDATE:** The Manager reported that he had an initial meeting with the Borough's engineer, ELA to begin the engineering for the Second Street Bridge project after receiving word that the Borough was awarded \$292,827.00 from the Commonwealth Financing Authority (CFA) Multimodal Transportation Fund (MTF) Program on March 16, 2023.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

**LOCAL ROAD SAFETY PLAN:** PennDOT's Local Road Safety Plan (LRSP) material was distributed for the committee to review. The Manager attended the LTAP Training Course for the LRSP and would like to proceed

with the LRSP for the Borough. The plan will identify and prioritize road safety projects in the Borough. There is no cost and it can be done 'in-house'. The Committee will review the information on creating a plan and have a recommendation for Council in May.

**MAPLE AVENUE STORMWATER:** The Manager reported that he met with ELA regarding the stormwater infrastructure that would be installed on Maple Avenue during the future street reconstruction project. ELA will submit a proposal to do initial grade and sizing of stormwater infrastructure on Maple Avenue in order to avoid conflicting grades with the proposed 8" CLDI water main and laterals to be installed by the Authority in 2023.

**MEMORIAL PARK STREAM/STORMWATER PLAN:** The Borough will be applying for funding through the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation Small Watershed Grant planning and technical awards in order to have a 'holistic' plan prepared for the park that would entail any streambank restoration as well as stormwater best management practices.
