

BOROUGH OF QUARRYVILLE
STREETS/INFRASTRUCTURE/PARKS COMMITTEE MEETING
August 12, 2025

The Streets/Infrastructure/Parks Committee held its meeting on the above date at 7:00 PM at the Municipal Building with the following persons present: Councilman Braightmeyer, Councilman Kreider, Councilwoman Bowman Maintenance Superintendent Bill Lamparter and Borough Manager Michelle Evans.

PUBLIC COMMENT: John & Sandy Slauch of S. Hillcrest Avenue stated their concerns about the parking setbacks on 3rd & 5th Streets. John stated that a municipality has to have a traffic study done before they can amend an ordinance about street signs etc. SIP will table this until more information is gathered.

Jessi Crotti of N. Church Street stated a complaint about the excessive water on her property after a heavy rain. Her street is a State road. Bill Lamparter will take pictures in the next rain event and then we will determine where the water is coming from and notify PennDOT about this situation.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: A motion to approve the July 8, 2025 meeting minutes was made by Councilman Kreider and seconded by Councilwoman Bowman. The motion was approved.

OLD BUSINESS:

a. Project Updates:

1. **West State/Fourth Intersection:** Bill Lamparter reported that the work on lowering the water main was completed on August 11, 2025. The intersection work should start again now that this issue is fixed.
2. **ELGT Connector:** The Borough Manager reported that DCED came back to us and will not allow the plans for a bike station, bench, ADA parking space, some paving, landscaping and replacement of the deteriorated bridge railing. This is not in their scope of things that we can use the extra grant money for. A zoom meeting is scheduled for Thursday, August 14th to discuss with DCED what their thoughts are for the use of the leftover grant money.

3. **Parking Setbacks -Third Street & Fifth Street:** SIP decided to table this recommendation to amend the ordinance for setbacks on Third & Fifth Streets until we can get a traffic study done. Michelle Evans will contact LTAP.
4. **Fritz/Chestnut Street Intersection:** SIP decided to table this recommendation to amend the ordinance for a stop sign at the abovementioned intersection until a decision is made about the setbacks on Third & Fifth streets. That way we will amend the ordinances together if passed.
5. **State/Lime St. Traffic Signal:** Bill Lamparter reported that this is still in the design process. At the September SIP meeting, Bill stated that the Quarryville Fire Company and our engineer from ELA will be in attendance to give their input about this traffic signal.
6. **Pedestrian Crosswalk at USPO:** Michelle Evans reported that LTAP's recommendation came in and they stated that there can be crosswalks done at the USPO, however, there are clear sight lines that makes for easy crossing of the street. If we were to go ahead with putting in a crosswalk, PennDOT approval is required. ADA ramps would have to be installed. And engineering studies would have to be done. SIP agreed to recommend to Council not to move forward with the crosswalk at the USPO due to the cost involved and the close proximity of other crosswalks that can be used in that area.
7. **Park Avenue Culvert:** Bill Lamparter presented 3 proposals for the work on the Park Avenue Culvert. All 3 proposals are over the threshold, so this job would need to go out on bid. The proposals range from \$27,000 to \$49,000. The permitting alone for working in a stream is estimated to be \$13,000. SIP will recommend to Council to get our engineer ELA engaged in this matter and to start the permitting process. Bill Lamparter will contact our solicitor to see if we are allowed to purchase the pipe, stone etc. to cut costs.

NEW BUSINESS:

a. Fifth Street Sidewalk: Good's Store emailed Bill Lamparter asking if it is ok for them to demo the 5th Street sidewalk the week of August 18th. The new sidewalk will be in back in by October 20th. The SIP committee agreed that this is ok. Bill Lamparter will get back to Good's Store and let them know this schedule is fine.

b. Crack Sealing: Bill Lamparter reported that crack sealing has begun and they are doing streets throughout the Borough.

c. Catch Basin Cleaning: Bill Lamparter reported that he got 2 prices on catch basin cleaning. East Lampeter would charge \$170/hour from Portal to Portal. They do not dump, so we would have to provide a dump site. PVD charges \$2,500 and they dump. Bill Lamparter will move forward with this. Borough employees will check all catch basins and clean the ones that need it the most.

d. Striping: Bill Lamparter reported that the re-striping of crosswalks etc. will hopefully be done by September.

ADJOURNMENT: Meeting adjourned at 8:16 pm by motion from Councilwoman Bowman and seconded by Councilman Kreider.
