

BOROUGH OF QUARRYVILLE
STREETS/INFRASTRUCTURE/PARKS COMMITTEE MEETING
AUGUST 8, 2022

The Streets/Infrastructure/Parks Committee held its meeting on the above date at 6:00 PM at the Municipal Building with the following persons present: Councilwoman Bowman, Councilman Kreider, Mayor Anthony Cavallaro and Borough Manager Scott Peiffer.

PUBLIC COMMENT: None

OLD BUSINESS:

SECOND STREET GRANT APPLICATION: The CFA-MTF grant application for the Second Street Bridge has been submitted by GMS. The total project cost is projected to be \$418,325.49. We are seeking \$292,827.00 in funding. This leaves a match of \$125,418.00. Possible sources for the match are: ARPA Funding or Capital Reserve Funds. The Manager recently had a zoom meeting with Speaker Cutler requesting support for the project.

ARLE GRANT FOURTH/CHURCH LIGHT: The Manager reported that GMS completed and submitted the application for the technology upgrade to the Fourth and Church Streets traffic light.

WEST END INTERSECTION UPDATE: The Manager reported on a recent zoom meeting with Good's Store engineers, ELA, and Jarred Neal from TPD regarding the timeline for the improvements to the store as well as the intersection. Good's parking lot will be expanded to the dry cleaner building property and the Fifth Street entrance to the store will be completed prior to intersection improvements. The intersection improvements will essentially shut off 2 of the existing store entrances. The intersection project is still slated for the summer/fall 2023 timeframe.

NEW BUSINESS:

TRAIL CONNECTOR GRANT UPDATE: Scott reported that we may apply for an ARPA grant through Lancaster County to use as a possible match to get DCNR or DCED grants. The cost opinion for the project is \$540,000.00. GMS Funding is working on an application at this time. The application is due 8/31/22.

LTAP REPORT FOR STANTON ROAD & ALL WAY STOP AT FIFTH AND CHESTNUT STREETS: Scott reported that LTAP met with him and Bill at both locations and will complete a study regarding placing speed humps or tables on Stanton Road and the possibility of an all way stop at the intersection of Fifth Street and Chestnut Street.

STATE STREET RUT FILL: The Manager reported the ruts have been filled on State Street and we will have the crosswalks filled in that were covered with asphalt. It seems to have helped the stormwater issue on East State Street.

PLAIN RESIDENCE STORMWATER ISSUE: There was some discussion on the letter received from Jack and Gina Plain on Maple Avenue. There was a stormwater design issue that is being corrected. The Plains assert that the Borough should pay for the changes made to the BMP after the initial installation did not work properly. Discussion with the rest of Council will follow before a decision is made.

ADJOURNMENT: Meeting adjourned at 7:05 pm.
