

BOROUGH OF QUARRYVILLE
STREETS/INFRASTRUCTURE/PARKS COMMITTEE MEETING
February 10, 2026

The Streets/Infrastructure/Parks Committee held its meeting on the above date at 7:00 PM at the Municipal Building with the following persons present: Councilman Groff, Councilwoman Hastings, Councilman Kreider, Borough Manager Michelle Evans and Maintenance Superintendent Bill Lamparter present.

PUBLIC COMMENT: None

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: A motion to approve the January 13, 2026 meeting minutes was made by Councilwoman Hastings and seconded by Councilman Kreider. The motion was approved.

OLD BUSINESS:

Project Updates:

1. West State/Fourth Intersection

This project is on hold until Spring. PennDOT has to do the final signal inspection. The Borough Manager will contact ELA about the plans stating that the contractor is supposed to remove any trees or utility lines that are obstructing the signal head. Bill Lamparter would like to address the lying water that happens at Turkey Hill and West Fifth Street crosswalks.

2. Parking Setbacks – Third Street & Fifth Street-

Bill Lamparter reported that once the weather breaks, the parking restriction signs will be placed on Third and Fifth Streets.

3. Park Ave. Culvert –

Bill Lamparter is planning a meeting with American Gunitite to come evaluate if the pipe can be repaired by them.

4. Maple Avenue Project-

Next step is Council approval for full reconstruction of Maple Avenue.

SIP discussed updating the sidewalk ordinance. SIP discussed reclaiming Maple Avenue as a less expensive alternative.

5. Lime & State Street Traffic Signal –

Michelle Evans and Bill Lamparter reported that as of 2/10/2026 the environmental study has been approved by PennDOT stating that

there are no bog turtles in the area of the intersection work. SIP discussed that their preference for the signals at this intersection be on mast arms. SIP also discussed meeting with the Quarryville Fire Company once design is complete to go over the signal change during a fire call.

6. 4th Street Truck Traffic-

ELA- will do a traffic study this year. After discussion, SIP recommends re-evaluate the ordinance for 4th Street.

7. Basketball Nets in right of way along streets-

SIP discussed this and would like to evaluate the current ordinance and discuss at the next Council meeting.

8. Pedestrian crossing on Hess Street-

Michelle Evans will contact the School District to see if they would be agreeable to moving the pedestrian crossing sign each day. This sign is in the way of the turning radius from 3rd Street onto Hess Street.

NEW BUSINESS:

Quarryville Borough Municipal Building: Devin Groff evaluated the municipal building on the morning of February 10, 2026. Devin expressed concerns and red flags. SIP discussed ideas to upgrade the municipal building/shop area or build a completely new municipal building. Devin would like the Borough Manager, Public Works and Police to come up with a list of needs, and wants for a functional Municipal building.

ADJOURNMENT: Meeting adjourned at 8:25pm by motion from Councilwoman Hastings and seconded by Councilman Kreider.
