

BOROUGH OF QUARRYVILLE
STREETS/INFRASTRUCTURE/PARKS COMMITTEE MEETING
FEBRUARY 6, 2023

The Streets/Infrastructure/Parks Committee held its meeting on the above date at 5:00 PM at the Municipal Building with the following persons present: Councilwoman Bowman, Councilman Braightmeyer, Councilman Kreider, Mayor Cavallaro, Maintenance Superintendent Bill Lamparter and Borough Manager Scott Peiffer.

PUBLIC COMMENT: None

OLD BUSINESS:

WEST END INTERSECTION UPDATE: The Manager reported on the intersection project. Construction is still expected to begin in the fall of 2023. Traffic Planning and Design, who is doing the engineering and design reported that the design has started and should take a few months to complete.

LIME/STATE STREETS SIGNAL: Scott gave an update on the project. ELA has completed the traffic counts and started the Traffic Signal Warrant Study.

HUFFNAGLE PARK SECURITY CAMERAS: Scott reported that he has contacted Frontier Communications and they are still working on how they can provide the internet service to that location.

ARLE Grant Update: Scott reported that the application for technology upgrade at Fourth and Church Streets was not funded. He has contacted GMS and we will apply to ARLE again or apply to another program for the technology upgrade to the signal.

NEW BUSINESS:

PENNDOT CONNECTS MEETING: Scott reported that he has attended a virtual session with the Lancaster County Planning Department, the Lancaster County Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and PennDOT Connects regarding the Transportation Network Plan. There are 2 goals in mind: Traffic Calming/Speed Control and Urban Core Economic Development. The Manager will continue to seek funding as well as develop a firm plan of what we are trying to accomplish with the plan.

STANTON ROAD SPEEDING: The Manager reported that roughly 2/3 of the surveys regarding residents for or against speed cushion installation have been returned. Most are in favor at this point.

REMEMBRANCE LOCK WALL PRESENTATION: Les Davis, Jr. of the Wakefield Lions Club presented an idea regarding an addiction awareness lock wall. The wall (chain link fence section) is used as an awareness tool for those battling addiction. The locks are personalized and attached to the fence. Committee members had a few questions regarding size and location of the wall. Memorial Park was the location that the Lions Club suggested, however they were open to other options. SECA Park was an area suggested by the Committee as another option. The Committee was in favor of the idea and encouraged Mr. Davis to return with more information and possible locations for the installation of the wall.

ADJOURNMENT: Meeting adjourned at 5:45 pm.
