

BOROUGH OF QUARRYVILLE
STREETS/INFRASTRUCTURE/PARKS COMMITTEE MEETING
JANUARY 3, 2023

The Streets/Infrastructure/Parks Committee held its meeting on the above date at 5:00 PM at the Municipal Building with the following persons present: Councilwoman Bowman, Councilman Braightmeyer, Councilman Kreider, Mayor Cavallaro and Borough Manager Scott Peiffer.

PUBLIC COMMENT: None

OLD BUSINESS:

WEST END INTERSECTION UPDATE: The Manager reported on the intersection project. Construction is still expected to begin in the fall of 2023. Traffic Planning and Design who is doing the engineering and design reported that the design will start in January and should take a few months to complete.

LIME/STATE STREETS SIGNAL: Scott gave an update on the project. ELA has started the Traffic Signal Warrant Study.

HUFFNAGLE PARK SECURITY CAMERAS: Scott reported that he has obtained costs for Wi-Fi service to the rest room building which will be necessary for the security cameras. The cost from Comcast will be \$129.95 per month + IP cost of \$29.95 per month. Scott will check with Frontier for their pricing.

AMERICA WALKS GRANT INFORMATION: Scott reported that the \$1,500.00 grant check has been received. He will form a small committee to map out a safe walking route in the Borough which will include wayfinding signage and an informational pamphlet to include historical information along the route.

NEW BUSINESS:

PENNDOT CONNECTS MEETING: Scott reported on a meeting held at the municipal building on December 14, 2022. Attendees included the Manager, Councilman Braightmeyer, Mayor Cavallaro, Maintenance Superintendent Bill Lamparter, Lancaster County Planning Department Representative Gary Jones, LTAP Representative Marvin Ta, Penn DOT Connects representative Chris Metka and resident Amanda Stevens. The discussion was on the future traffic issues facing the borough and developing a plan to deal with them. PennDOT Connects will follow up in January regarding the next steps to possibly create a traffic plan for the borough.

STANTON ROAD SPEEDING: Councilman Braightmeyer raised the question regarding the required survey prior to installing speed humps to calm traffic on Stanton Road. The Manager will seek assistance on developing the survey in order to get input from residents in the area. This is a requirement prior to authorizing the installation of speed humps.

ADJOURNMENT: Meeting adjourned at 5:40 pm.
