

**BOROUGH OF QUARRYVILLE**  
**STREETS/INFRASTRUCTURE/PARKS COMMITTEE MEETING**  
**MARCH 6, 2023**

The Streets/Infrastructure/Parks Committee held its meeting on the above date at 5:00 PM at the Municipal Building with the following persons present: Councilwoman Bowman, Councilman Braightmeyer, Councilman Kreider, Mayor Cavallaro and Borough Manager Scott Peiffer.

**PUBLIC COMMENT:** None

**OLD BUSINESS:**

**LIME/STATE STREETS SIGNAL UPDATE:** The Borough's engineer, ELA, is nearing completion of the traffic signal warrant study. As part of the study, PennDOT requires a Traffic Signal Maintenance Agreement (TSMA) on file, which we do not have. Council will act on a resolution authorizing the Borough Manager to sign the TSMA and send to ELA for PennDOT approval at the March 6, 2023 meeting (tonight). S/I/P can begin discussing a recommendation for the Borough to proceed with engineering/permitting of the signal. The engineering/permitting was listed as a project in the 2022 Capital Budget at a cost of \$50,000.00.

**HUFFNAGLE PARK SECURITY CAMERAS:** The Manager reviewed the costs from Malstrom Alarm for a 5-camera system for security at Huffnagle Park. The cost estimate is \$5,927.00. Frontier can provide internet service to accommodate the ability for the police to live view the cameras from a phone app. S/I/P will present to Council for approval.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

**FOURTH STREET PAVING REPAIR:** The Manager distributed copies of the paving repair proposal for Fourth Street. The areas that need milled and overlaid are 'horse rut' areas where the wearing coarse has been worn down to expose the base paving. The cost estimate from Asphalt Repair and Paving for the repairs is \$16,850.00. There was also an estimate for swale repair paving at Memorial Park near the concession stand for \$2,100.00. The Manager will get 2 more estimates for the work.

**HUFFNAGLE PARK PATHWAY PAVING:** The Manager reported that he is also seeking estimates on paving and repairing all the pathways at Huffnagle Park.

**SPEED HUMP SURVEY RESULTS:** Scott reported that the results of the Speed Hump Survey for Stanton Road and Fifth Street have been tabulated. The

response to the survey was very good with approximately 75% of the surveys returned. Those in favor of the Borough continuing to pursue the possibility of speed humps was: Stanton Road - 92%, Fifth Street - 72%. The Manager will reach out to LTAP to see what the next step is.

**TRAFFIC CIRCULATION STUDY UPDATE:** Scott reported that he appeared before the Lancaster County Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) last week requesting support for the proposed traffic circulation study. The MPO was in full support of the study.

**ADJOURNMENT:** Meeting adjourned at 5:55 pm.
