

BOROUGH OF QUARRYVILLE
STREETS/INFRASTRUCTURE/PARKS COMMITTEE MEETING
OCTOBER 11, 2022

The Streets/Infrastructure/Parks Committee held its meeting on the above date at 6:00 PM at the Municipal Building with the following persons present: Councilwoman Bowman, Councilman Braightmeyer, Mayor Anthony Cavallaro and Borough Manager Scott Peiffer.

PUBLIC COMMENT: None

OLD BUSINESS:

WEST END INTERSECTION UPDATE: The Manager reported on the intersection project. Construction is still expected to begin in the fall of 2023.

LIME/STATE STREETS SIGNAL: Scott gave an update on the project. MGS recommends applying for a Multimodal Transportation Fund grant when we are ready to apply. Scott will contact ELA regarding engineering fees as well as a current cost opinion. We have proposed \$50,000.00 in engineering in the 2023 Capital Budget for the engineering and design for the signal.

NEW BUSINESS:

TRAIL CONNECTOR GRANT UPDATE: Scott reported that we have applied for Lancaster County ARPA funding and are awaiting the results. We have also had Wilson Consulting modify the plan by placing the 'off ramp' from the trail onto North Lime Street and to Geiger Avenue as Phase 1. This will provide access to the trail for residents and those who want to get off of the trail for services in the Borough. Phase 2 may include a safe passage to Hess Street depending on what the trail users seem to want. We may utilize the trail access as a support reason for the signal installation at State Street and Lime Street. We will look at the recently opened fall round of funding for DCNR or the spring round at the latest.

LTAP REPORT FOR STANTON ROAD & ALL WAY STOP AT FIFTH AND CHESTNUT STREETS: The LTAP reports came back this week. An all-way stop was not recommended since much of the criteria was not met to warrant the all-way stop. A plan for traffic calming on Stanton Road was presented in the Stanton Road study. It included speed humps and traffic circles. There was discussion on surveying the residents, which would have to be done regardless in order to proceed with traffic calming options.

FIELD FEES-MEMORIAL PARK: The Manager discussed the fees for park use at Memorial Park in 2023. He will have some updated fees to present at the next meeting.

BURNING ORDINANCE DISCUSSION: There was some discussion on the burning policy that is in place. The policy is not an ordinance so it is not enforceable. Council will need to weigh in on the creation of an ordinance. The Manager presented Burning Ordinances from Strasburg and Denver Boroughs.

ADJOURNMENT: Meeting adjourned at 7:15 pm.
