

BOROUGH OF QUARRYVILLE – COUNCIL MINUTES

WORK SESSION – NOVEMBER 23, 2020

Borough Council held a Work Session on the above date at 7:00 PM at the Municipal Building. Council President Joy Kemper called the meeting to order with the following persons present: Council Members Susan Noel, Brian Braightmeyer, Jim Kreider, and Diane Hastings. Borough Manager Scott Peiffer was also in attendance.

PUBLIC COMMENT: None

BUDGET WORK SESSION:

Proposed 2021 Budget Review - The Manager reviewed the proposed 2021 budget to Council. There was discussion on various items in the budget. A motion to advertise the 2021 proposed budget with possible reserve amount shown on cover page was made by Councilwoman Hastings and seconded by Councilwoman Noel. Motion passed unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS:

Oak Lane Agreement - The Manager updated Council on the purchase of the Oak Lane Parking Lot. The agreement has been signed and a deposit check of \$5,000.00 has been prepared. Settlement for the property will occur in December.

NEW BUSINESS:

Beards for Brothers – A motion to approve the Beards for Brothers fund raiser for the Police Department for the month of November was made by Councilwoman Noel and seconded by Councilman Kreider. The motion passed unanimously. A motion to extend the Beards for Brothers fund raiser into the month of December was made by Councilman Braightmeyer but received no second. The motion died.

PPL Streetlight LED Retrofit- A motion to approve Resolution 2020-19 which allows PPL to provide streetlights to the Borough was made by Councilwoman Hastings and seconded by Councilman Braightmeyer. The motion passed unanimously.

Police Department Policies and Procedures - Councilwoman Noel presented information on a police policies and procedures company (Lexipol) that would provide and update polices and procedures for the department. The initial cost for the first year is around \$19,000.00 and then there is an annual fee for the updates. Councilwoman Noel asked Council to consider possible budget savings from this year be applied to purchase the Lexipol system in 2021. The Police Foundation may also consider to help fund the Lexipol system. A decision to purchase the system may be made in 2021.

Low Volume Road Grant - The Manager announced the Borough has been awarded \$40,375.00 from the Lancaster County Conservation District for reconstruction of Geiger Avenue in 2021.

ADJOURNMENT: At 8:20 PM, Council President Kemper called for a motion to adjourn. Councilman Braightmeyer offered that motion with Councilwoman Hastings seconding. The motion to adjourn was unanimously approved.
